Post 16 Results at Imberhorne

Imberhorne's Sixth Form students celebrated today as they received their A level results.

148 students were entered for Advanced level courses this year with half of the entries leading to A or B grades. The average point score per candidate increased for the third year running, setting a new record for the school.

17 students achieved 3 or more A grades. Particularly successful subjects included Maths, where 17 out of 37 students achieved an A grade and Chemistry where 11 out of 24 students also achieved the top grade. Other particularly noteworthy results were achieved in Economics, Drama, Fine Art, Geography, History, Media and Psychology. Amongst our vocational subjects Art & Design, Music Technology and Leisure & Tourism were very successful. The results in Performing Arts were outstanding with all 4 students attaining A grades.
