

IMBERBURSARY

Thank you for expressing an interest in applying for an **IMBERBURSARY**. This sheet will give you more information about what it involves and how it can help you to develop your learning.

What is the **IMBERBURSARY**?

It's a sum of money that you can apply for to enable you to learn about something that you're interested in. It might be something that you have not necessarily learnt about in school or it might be something you've touched on in school that you'd like to know more about.

Why would I need money to do that?

Imagine you want to learn more about the paintings of Mark Rothko. You might want to go to Tate Modern in London to see some of his work; this bursary could be used to pay for transport to the gallery (your parents obviously need to supervise your travelling, where necessary). Whatever your interests, we may be able to fund you to help you learn more.

How much money can I ask for?

Each request will be treated individually and it depends on how ambitious your intended project is.

How do I apply for the funding?

You need to pick up an **IMBERBURSARY** application form from Ms C. Barr, complete the form and return it to Ms Barr who will then consider your application based on whether your intended project is achievable and carefully costed.

Do I need to do anything in return for the money?

Yes! You need to produce a report in whatever format you like (e.g. video, poster, mindmap, presentation in tutor group or assembly etc. about what you have learnt.)

So what do I do next?

If you are still interested, you can discuss your plans with Ms Barr before you pick up an application form. Then get thinking, get your application form back to Ms C. Barr and get stuck into your project!

IMPORTANT: *Remember to discuss your project with your family. Will they need to supervise any of your proposed activities? If so, ask them if they are willing and able to do that!*
