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12	Skills show (London) Offered to sixth form students who wish to research apprenticeship and employment opportunities Oxbridge Workshop – shared with Sackville School High achievers (at GCSE) are encouraged to attend to hear about the opportunities available and the application process	Post School options PD sessions are dedicated to researching all the options open to them Unifrog launched – a database and library for researching higher education courses and apprenticeships UCAS Higher Education Conference All students attend the conference which has stands from UK universities and colleges and some apprenticeship providers. Follow up activities consolidate the research Oxbridge Conference Offered to all students wishing to find out about the courses offered and the competitive application process	Future Day Students opt in to presentations given by representatives from universities, apprenticeships, gap year providers and local employers Futures Week A week for work shadowing or work experience, attending open days and completing activities to strengthen work and university applications Early Applicant Support A series of meetings (4 x 1 hour) to begin the Early application process

3 Skills show (London)

Offered to sixth form students who wish to research apprenticeship and employment opportunities

Personal statement/ covering letters workshop (Lifeskills)

Provided by an external agent, students draft their personal statements or covering letters – ready to be handed in at their next PD session

PD Sessions are dedicated to UCAS or apprenticeship applications – students select their pathway

Results Day

Support is provided over 2 days for
