




KEY PRINCIPLES FOR CHARACTER EDUCATION

In English we assess by marking class work in books and through a timed assessment each half term.

In Year 9, our assessments are designed to prepare them for type of assessment they'll get at GCSE.

How can you support your child at home?

- Encourage your child to read a variety of texts across different genres and time periods. Reading increases vocabulary, decoding skills and writing fluency.
- If your child needs further support in their grammar and writing skills, free websites like echalk and BBC Bitesize may be helpful. If you would like to purchase a book, we recommend the CGP KS3 Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Work Book.
- Reading lists are published on the school website and Google Classroom.



Maths in Year 9

Maths in year 9 completes KS3 by getting all students ready to study GCSE mathematics. Key topics covered are:

- Number standard form plus indices
- Ratio and Proportion unitary method and multipliers
- Algebra factorising and algebraic fractions
- Shape and Space circles and volume
- Statistics probability and different data types

- Times tables These underpin most of the maths curriculum so having a firm grasp of these has huge benefits, especially using them to divide also.
- Revisiting notes from class Keeping clear notes in their folders helps students to revise

We study a variety of subjects on rotation, these are more challenging than students have experienced before!



How can you support your child in Science?


- Most important: make sure they have their burgundy science revision guide purchased in Year 7.
