Attendance % (4<sup>th</sup> November – 25<sup>th</sup> June) will determine levels of success in this area:

Bronze = 95% +, Silver = 97%+, Gold = 100%

#### Attitude to Learning

This will be assessed via the reports based on Attitude to Learning scores from subject teachers:

Bronze = mainly motivated;

Silver = 50:50 motivated/outstanding;

Gold = mainly outstanding

This will involve students participating in the life of the school. They will have to complete at least three areas (the list is not exhaustive):

Being part of a school club regularly

Participating in a charity event


