Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s)

We are over four weeks in to term, and I am very pleased to have this opportunity to write to you and let you know that I have had some really positive feedback from staff about how well they have started the year. The students have demonstrated a willingness to settle well and to positively engage with their studies. In addition, their standards of conduct and personal presentation are proving to be an excellent example for the new Year 7s to follow.

Year 8 is an exciting year for the students and I would urge you to encourage your child to make the most of the opportunities on offer. Last year I introduced a 'graduation' criteria checklist for students to work towards completing. This involved the students participating in a number of activities, both individually and as part of their form, which they gained recognition for at the end of the year.
