Dear Parents and Carers

We are busy preparing the school for our planned mass testing from Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March, we hope the days run smoothly and wish to thank you for taking the time to provide consent and to book time slots for the tests. It has been a busy week, we have been overwhelmed with the speed of your response and the fact that consent has now been gathered for very nearly the whole school population.

You may be aware there has been some discussion about the wearing of masks in school. At the moment the guidance, reiterated from Public Health England, is that masks should be worn indoors where social distancing cannot be maintained. That means, of course, in classrooms and corridors. My message for students on this matter is that wearing masks is about protecting everyone in our community. We have some vulnerable students and staff who are reassured by testing and by the wearing of masks, and may feel unable to attend without these additional precautions. By wearing masks, we are supporting each other at this time. As you are aware this will be reviewed at Easter. I urge parents who believe their son/daughter to be exempt to let us know in advance so we avoid any difficulties. We will provide as many opportunities as possible for students to remove masks, between lessons when outdoors.

I would like to also remind you that our canteens, on both sites, will be operational next week at break and lunchtime. We are retaining the separation of year groups at these times, each with their own food distribution point and/or time.
