Dear Parents and Carers

It was a great pleasure and a moment of immense pride to see our musical performers represent themselves so well in the Federation music performance at Oathall Community College on Monday afternoon. Students performed classics as diverse as Vivaldi and Elton John as part of a contemporary rock orchestra upwards of 150 in size. The performances showed an incredible togetherness and represented exactly why the Federation schools all believe so strongly in the importance and power of the Arts in education. A big thank you must go to Mr Williams and Mr Moorhouse for their support in giving our students this opportunity. This is the second student participation event of this year, following on from the highly successful public speaking event hosted by Imberhorne before the half term break. Next week, some of our students will visit Downlands Community School to participate in a multi-sports event, followed by Year 10 GCSE Dance students performing in a Federation Dance Show at Chequer Mead Theatre on Tuesday 17th June. I will be meeting with the Headteachers of Sackville, Downlands and Oathall later this month to review our work together this year and plan for more exciting events and opportunities for collaboration over the coming year.

We have been delighted to welcome Ms Pegden into our school community this week as she starts to take on the role of SENDCo from Mrs Price. The month of June will be a transitional one where Mrs Price will be working alongside Ms Pegden, who will get to know staff, students and families before Mrs Price departs. I am sure a number of SEND families will come into contact with Ms Pegden over the coming weeks and I know that she is very excited to start working with you.

Although Year 11 and 13 have now moved onto study leave, exams continue for both year groups, as well as targeted revision sessions as per the schedule sent out before the holiday. We were extremely proud of Year 11 in particular on their last formal day of school before the half term break - their maturity and confidence was plain for all to see as they made memories and reflected on their time at Imberhorne. I know that staff will be very sad to say farewell to those that will not be staying on with us for Sixth Form. In a previous letter I had said that our door remains open to leavers should we be able to provide support, advice and guidance and this will always be the case.

Year 9 students will also sit their end of year (and end of Key Stage) exams in the week beginning 16th June. They will have been well informed of these by their teachers, with clear advice and guidance given on the types of questions, specific skills and the knowledge that they will need to revise (as well as methods to do so). Please tell them that they need not worry about these exams. They are an opportunity to showcase their excellent work across the last three years and gain extremely valuable experience of sitting in a controlled exam environment, but we will be seeing these simply as a benchmark, giving us valuable information about how we can support students in their readiness for Key Stage 4. Year 10 mock exams will follow in the week beginning Monday 23rd June.









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You will have seen that this half term is an extremely busy one in terms of trips, events and extracurricular activities - a fairly full list of these were provided in my letter before the half term break. This week we hosted a Celebration Evening for students in Year 7 who were nominated by staff for individual and subject-based awards. The pride and community spirit that we have seen from them as a cohort across this year was in abundance and we look forward to the events for Years 7, 8 and 10 in the coming weeks. We are also very thankful for the Year 10 RE trip to the Buddhapadipa Temple and the Year 12 Biology trip to Wakehurst Place that took place this week. I know that staff were, as always, impressed with our students' impeccable behaviour and engagement.

There has been some recent press about proposed changes to legislation around school uniform and branded items, which it is suggested may come into force within the next two years. We would like to be forearmed with the views of our families as well as other stakeholders to enable us to be ready to make any decisions that may be necessary if this legislation is passed.
