GCSE and A Level Exams

I hope our exam year groups (students in Year 11 and 13) use the holiday period well. They need to rest and recuperate but also use time to revise for their examinations. **The first GCSE exam is on Monday 16th May, the first A Level exam on Thursday 19th May.** Effective revision is the best way to ensure exam success.
