Dear Parents and Carers

I hope, once the strong winds have died down, that you are able to have an enjoyable half term break. It has been a very focussed period since Christmas and I sense that students and staff are very tired at this stage. A half term break should revitalise everyone. School resumes on **Monday 28th February**.

Accelerated Reader

On Thursday 3rd March it is World Book Day. As you are hopefully aware we prioritise reading in the school because it underpins achievement and progress across the curriculum. We frequently talk to students about their reading age, this does not always correspond with chronological age. Nationally the reading age of young people is below their chronological age. At Imberhorne it is quite possible to have students, in Key Stage 3, with reading ages that are several years apart. We have many avid readers who may have a reading age several years ahead of their actual age, whilst other students can have a reading age a few years below their actual age. In Year 11 students will sit GCSE exams that require a reading age of 15 / 16 in order to access the language and vocabulary being used. Year 11 students must therefore prepare for **mock exams (running from 4th March to 11th March)** as well as these other assessments taking place before and after their mock exams.
