

Top Tips

- Ensure that your child attends every day possible. For the majority of subjects, lesson content can only be covered once
- Don't accept 'I've got no homework'. Students can always be revising content – use Google Classroom
- Ensure your child has a suitable place to study with all the required materials and is avoiding distractions
- Encourage alternative methods of study subject related TV programmes, newspaper articles

Target Grades and Reports

- Targets are for the end of Key Stage 4 (end of Year 11)
- Targets are aspirational and anticipate very good progress (equivalent to the top 20% nationally)
- Students can exceed targets

- Targets use prior performance data and teacher's knowledge of students
- By the end of Year
 10 we expect most students to be within
 1 grade of their target

Students will be assessed through a combination of their class work and timed writing throughout the year.

We interweave the teaching of Language and Literature as so many of the skills are transferable.

How can you support your child at home?

- Encourage your child to read a variety of texts across different genres and time periods. Reading increases vocabulary, decoding skills and writing fluency.
- If your child needs further support in their grammar and writing skills, free websites like e-Chalk and BBC Bitesize may be helpful.
- We encourage all students to purchase their GCSE texts as it makes revision easier and more efficient.
- Encourage your child to organise his or her notes as the texts are being studied. This will help to ease any unnecessary pressure.

Year 10 Curriculum Maths

Year 10 is the start of the GCSE Maths course

Students are divided into 3 broad groups:

- <u>Set 1</u> study the higher tier and have the option to enter Further Maths GCSE
- <u>Set 2</u> study a blend of higher and foundation tier
- <u>Set 3</u> study the foundation tier

All students will study topics from number, algebra, ratio and proportion, geometry, statistics and probability

How can you support your child in Maths?

- Ensure they have a working scientific calculator. We recommend
 the Casio fx-85 GTX or, if they wish to continue maths at A-level,
 the Casio fx-991 EX. Both are suitable for the GCSE exam.
- Be familiar with and encourage the use of the web-based resources we use for revision:
 - Hegarty Maths*
 - Method Maths*
 - Maths Genie
- Purchase a revision guide. We recommend the CGP revision guide and workbook for the AQA course.
- Encourage them to work hard each lesson and ask questions in class or about the homework we want to help!
