School Application Deadline: Wednesday 14th November 2018

UCAS Deadline: Tuesday 15th January 2018

- ▶ Personal Statement review by tutors (ongoing)
- ▶ UCAS application booklets issued next week
 - the start of the application process

The UCAS application process

What the applicant does...

- Writes a personal statement,
- Completes an online application,
- Pays
 - £13 for a single course
 - £24 for more than one course (max 5 course choices)

What the school does...

- Supports the personal statement process,
- Provides a reference,
- Predicts applicants A level grades,
- Checks the application and sends it to UCAS
