Please may we remind you that we cannot authorise parents to take Sixth Form students out of school for family holidays unless in exceptional circumstances, and under no circumstances should students be requesting time off from school to go on holiday with friends.

We would ask that students are sensible with paid work and whilst writing, I would also like to confirm that all Sixth Form students are required to attend:

- A PD (Personal Development) lesson on Wednesday Period 5, once a fortnight, (Week A)
- A weekly designated morning mentoring slot with their personal mentor these were confirmed on 19th Sept.
- A termly mentor meeting with their personal mentor these appointments will be confirmed well in advance with students.

For those of you not present at the briefing evening, I would like to advise you that we monitor attendance and punctuality to lessons closely. If your son/daughter is unable to come to school please call our Sixth Form secretary on 01342 310986 before 8.40am or email <u>sixthform@imberhorne.co.uk</u> on the day of their absence. Any student who is absent or arrives late to a lesson, registration or assembly without good reason will first be issued with a reminder, then a warning from myself and if the problem persists, a meeting with parents.

The dress code for Sixth Form has been explained to students and was highlighted at the briefing evening. We expect students to wear clothes suitable for a place of work. We would very much appreciate your support in this matter, as we are, of course, a sixth form within a school and sixth form students are role models to younger students. The details are in the slides from the briefing evening.

We must also make you aware that if high value items (phones/i-pads,laptops etc) are brought into school, we can take no responsibility for any loss or damage to the equipment.

We have lots of exciting events planned for the coming year and the Sixth Form team very much hopes that your son/daughter will have an enjoyable and successful year.
