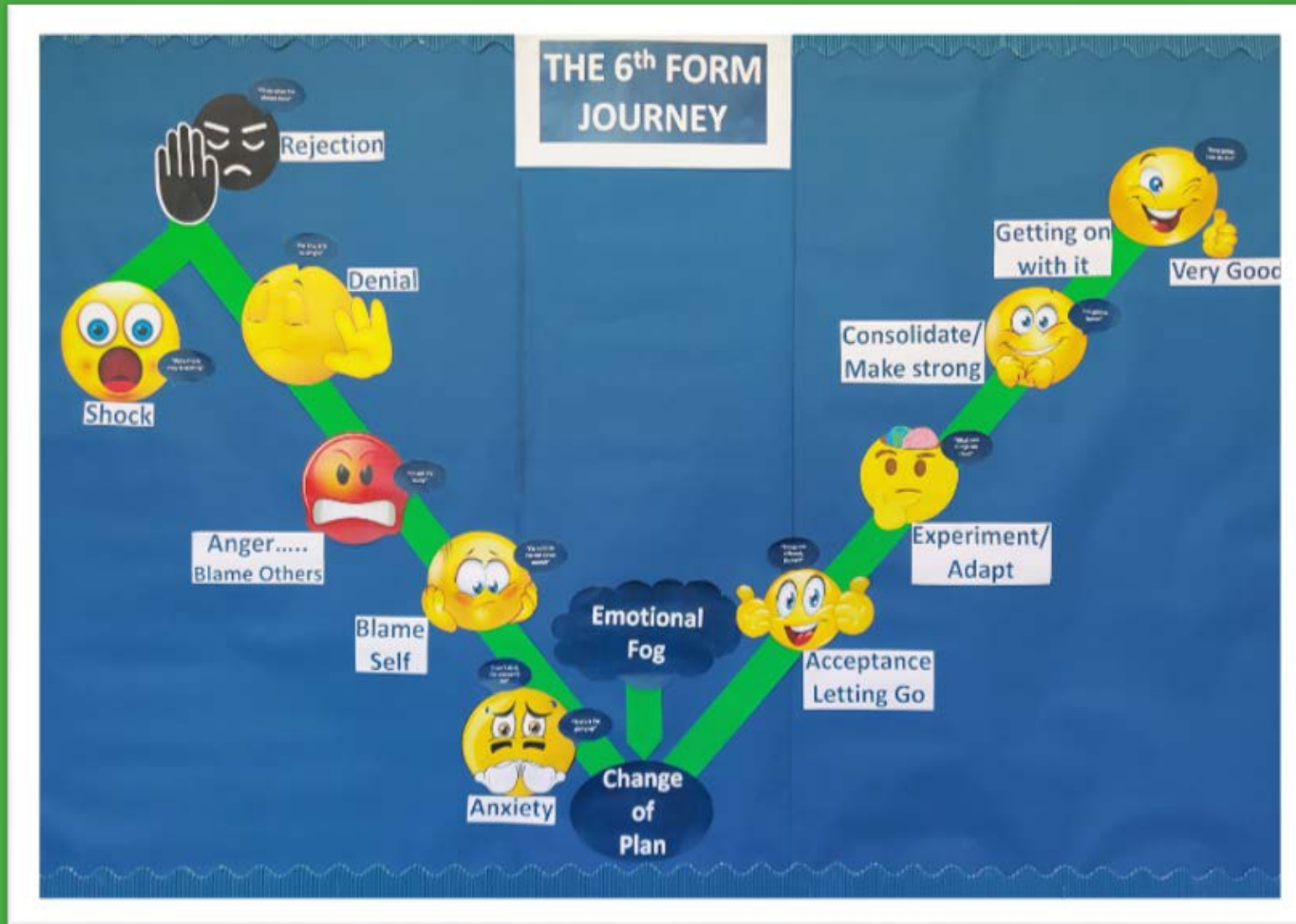

# Attendance

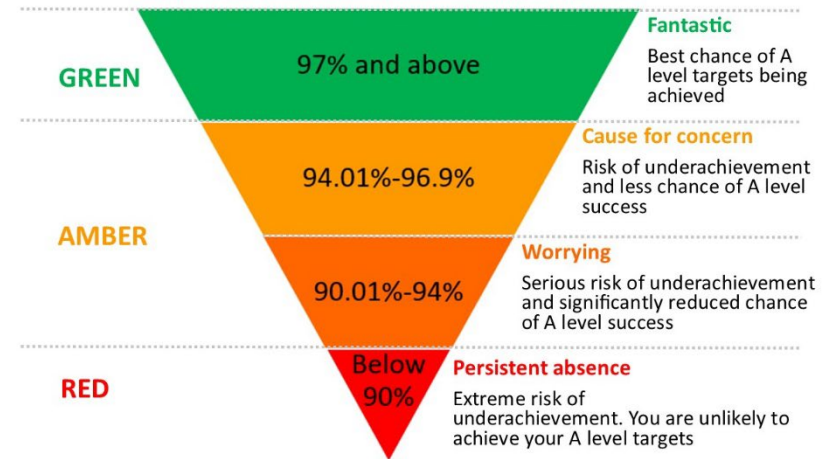
- Students are expected to attend and engage with all aspects of sixth form life. This includes all lessons, GLHs, registration, assemblies and enrichment

## Withdrawal of Examination Entry Fees

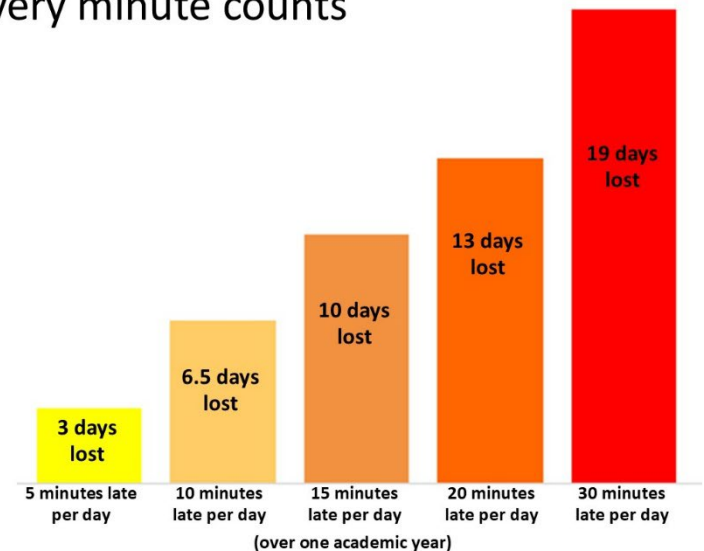

However, the school reserves the right to withdraw this payment for all or individual subjects the student is entered for on the grounds of attendance. **UCAS Deadline: Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> October 2025**

**Admission Tests: on various dates depending on the tests**

## All other students

**School Application Deadline: Friday 14<sup>th</sup> November 2025**

**UCAS Deadline: Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2026**

**Fee:** There is a fee of £28.95 for up to 5 choices
